English

In English we will be reading the superhero tale of 'Supertato'. We will learn the story by heart and then 'innovate' it by changing aspects of the story such as the characters. Work on sentences will continue, especially the use of capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

We will also be learning the Year 1 common exception words. We will also continue with our daily phonics lessons.

History & Geography

Our Humanities this half term will mostly be History based. We will learn about the lives of some real-life superheroes from the past. The children will find out about people like Rosa Parks, Florence Nightingale and Thomas Barnardo and how they have contributed to a better life for us all.

PSHE & RE

The theme for this half terms RE is 'Easter-Palm Sunday' and the key question we will be looking at is "Why was Jesus welcomed like a king or celebrity by the crowds on Palm Sunday?"

In PSHE, we will be learning about 'Healthy Me'

Science

Our Science for this half term is 'Plants'. In this unit about plants, children will learn to name the basic parts of a plant, including seeds. They will have the opportunity to plant their own seeds and to make observations of how they grow over time. Children will also learn to identify, name and describe a variety of garden and wild plants as well as evergreen and deciduous trees.

Maths

This half term will focus on:

- Addition and subtraction within 20.
 - Place Value to 50

Key maths vocabulary

Add, addition, plus, take away, subtract, minus, subtraction, is equal to, equals, is the same as.

Physical Education - Ball Skills

In this unit, pupils will explore their fundamental ball skills such as throwing and catching, rolling, hitting a target, dribbling with both hands and feet and kicking a ball.

Music

'Learning to Listen'

Music is made up of high and low sounds, long and short sounds, and loud and quiet sounds. Explore these sounds and create your own very simple melodies.

Computing

'Data'

In Computing, the children will be creating 'Charts' and 'Pictograms'. Develop an understanding of interpreting data from a chart using different ways to present their work.

Design Technology

In DT, we will be looking at the topic of 'Puppets'. We will design and make a hand puppet and look at how fabric can be joined together and decorated. The children will evaluate their products and showcase their puppets to friends.
